

Application for Admission

- 1. Visit <u>www.wmcc.edu</u> to complete the free application for admission. Students can choose to apply online or print and mail in their completed application.
- Applicants may need to submit an official High School transcript or GED HiSET to be officially admitted to a WMCC Associate Degree or Certificate Program. Transcripts can be mailed to 2020 Riverside Dr, Berlin, NH 03570 or emailed to <u>wmccADMISSIONS@ccsnh.edu</u>.
- 3. If you have earned prior college credit, please forward an official college transcript to the Admissions Office for transfer credit evaluation to be completed after acceptance into a program.
- 4. If you want to be considered for Financial Aid, complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. You may file online at studentaid.gov and use the **WMCC Title IV Code: 005291.**
- 5. Veterans must submit their Certificate of Eligibility for VA Education Benefits, and any other documentation required for WMCC to certify enrollment with the Department of Veterans Affairs.
- 6. Attend an Onboarding Session to develop a deeper understanding of program requirements and student services that are available to assist academic success. Students will register for classes during the onboarding appointment.
