1. Visit www.wmcc.edu to complete the free application for admission. Students can choose to apply online or print and mail in their completed application.
2. Applicants may need to submit an official High School transcript or GED – HiSET to be officially admitted to a WMCC Associate Degree or Certificate Program. Transcripts can be mailed to 2020 Riverside Dr, Berlin, NH 03570 or emailed to wmccADMISSIONS@ccsnh.edu.
3. If you have earned prior college credit, please forward an official college transcript to the Admissions Office for transfer credit evaluation to be completed after acceptance into a program.
4. If you want to be considered for Financial Aid, complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. You may file online at studentaid.gov and use the **WMCC Title IV Code: 005291**.
5. Veterans must submit their Certificate of Eligibility for VA Education Benefits, and any other documentation required for WMCC to certify enrollment with the Department of Veterans Affairs.
6. Attend an Onboarding Session to develop a deeper understanding of program requirements and student services that are available to assist academic success. Students will register for classes during the onboarding appointment.
